 - a) At-Large Leyton: Dave, what is the process for heat being turned on in halls?

- 9) Student Government Report
- a) This week was very standard. We had our first semi-normal meeting.
 - b) We seated 3 new senators this week. UROC, Campustown and GPSS
 - c) We put forth some extra money for ASSET allocations
 - d) We put forth legislation to expand the University Affairs Committee
 - e) We shot down two bills for some discrepancies in funding and dates
 - f) President Staudt came and talked about tuition
 - g) We have a potential name for the new Residence Hall that will be presented to the Board of Regents for approval. Proposal is Geoffrey Hall after President Geoffrey.
 - h) We are having a few safety walks around campus in the coming weeks.
 - i) Tuition increases. Right now there is a proposal for 2% raise for in-state and 3% for out-of-state. They also want to raise tuition for 5 majors. Computer Science, Animal Science, Biology, Industrial Design, Natural Resource Ecology and Management. This would be an alternative to the raises that would just affect upperclassmen. They are looking to raise the tuition by around \$1,600 for those 5 majors.
 - i) Jacob: What are the justifications for the increase on those majors?
 - ii) StuGov Zoey: All I have heard is that those majors tend to make more money
 - iii) Jacob: These majors are very lab intensive. The student to faculty ratio is much lower. You get more one-on-one time with faculty. You also use a lot of expensive equipment that costs a lot of money. It is seen as unfair for other student to subsidize the education of the student in those majors.
 - iv) Kay: Why would it be more applicable for upperclassmen to pay more?
 - v) StuGov Sam: Upperclassmen are in more technical classes and it costs more to get qualified instructors to teach them.
 - vi) StuGov Cody: Governor Branstad did not like the two-tiered system
 - vii) Friley Katie: What would they do about colleges that already have a two-tiered system? Such as business and engineering, etc.?
 - viii) Logan: We would not change tuition. It would stay as the two-tiered system.
