

- Informational Speakers:
 - Reggie's Sleep Out [Austen Giles]
 - Student organization that supports youth and shelter services for the homeless youth in Iowa. We have been working in the Drake area for the last 10 years and have established ourselves as one of the biggest and unique fundraisers in the area. Last year, we made over \$100,000 by putting 300 people in Jack Trice Stadium. We want to boost attendance this year and try to get to 1,000 people. Reggie's Sleep Out will take place in March. You can sign up as a group or solo. Using cardboard or other materials, you will construct a "house" or structure and sleep under it all night to raise money for YSS and youth homelessness. You may win dinner with Coach Campbell and family or even a helicopter ride over Jack Trice.
 - Ben [Friley]: Is there a cost to participate?
 - Austen: No, it is free to do, but obviously we want people to try and raise money for the cause. People can also just sleep in a sleeping bag instead of in a "built" structure for fun.
 - DOR Rates [Lynn Jones]
 - We want to talk about the rate proposal for the Fall 2018-Spring 2019 school year. All of the money that we have to put into our facilities come from the room rates from residence halls and on-campus apartments. We are looking to do many updates for not only Freddy Court, but also a majority of the residence halls. We have a current decrease in the enrollment of new freshman. This is significant for us. For Fall 2018, we are using the projections given to us by Enrollment Services of 6,397 incoming students. If this number is lower, then it will have significant impact on our financials. We are proposing a 2.9% increase for residence halls and apartments and a 1.9% increase for SUV. As of now, we could

put 4.3 million dollars into our buildings. If occupancy rates go down, we will have to delay some of these needed projects.

- Angle [Maple]: What would a 0.5% increase used to cover free laundry mean money wise?
 - Lynn [DOR]: Around \$400,000. This would increase the cost of housing for each student. We will figure out the cost per student to do this and will send you the information.
- Dominique [Buchanan]: Is Legacy still affiliated with DOR?
 - Lynn [DOR]: Yes.
- Benjamin [Friley]: It would be \$23 more dollars to live in Friley to have free laundry, so I would like to show my support for free laundry.
- Analese [Buchanan]: Would it be possible to have a flat rate increase instead of raising it by specific room rate for free laundry?
 I would pay more than a Friley room.
 - Lynn [DOR]: This is feedback that we would love to have.
- Matthew [Hesler]: Is the free laundry affecting us negatively this year?
 - Lynn [DOR]: In the grand scheme of things, it's not an amount that will have a huge impact.
- Dominique [Buchanan]: I would like to mention that more people seem to be doing laundry now that it is free.
 - Lynn [DOR]: The dollar amount I shared keeps all of the costs of water, electricity, etc., at a flat rate so that is good to point out.

- Student Government Report:
 - Lilian [StuGov]: I got seated on the Diversity Inclusion committee and we seated an At-Large member to the PR committee.
 - Cody [StuGov]: We issued a proclamation to congratulate the Cyclone Marching Band. They will receive a copy of this.
 - Jacob [StuGov]: The next City Hall will occur at City Hall at 6 pm. We want to go and voice our opposition or support for the current issues happening here in Ames.

 - Jacob [StuGov]: It is close to the current number.
 - Jacob [StuGov]: There are three At Large positions open. Email us for more information! We choose not to fund the New York Times. However, the Wall Street journal will give us a year long run for free starting on January 1st. This was not finalized by contract, but will hopefully be soon.
 - Cody [StuGov]: We have a limited amount of time, so if you have any thing that is bugging you, please let us know as soon as possible, especially before StuGov elections in February. Now would be a great time for ideas and feedback!

- Exec. Sarah [NRHH]: We had an election on Tuesday. How did the people who got elected feel about the student housing concern?
 - Cody [StuGov]: The mayor elect has not previously served on the council, and we don't know his exact thoughts on the matter. We will be sending him our bill and he has shown a willingness to work with us currently. I'm optimistic that he will be responsive.
 - Juan [StuGov]: I serve on a board with the mayor elect.
